# CURRENT PROGRESS

## Remains affected by explosive ordnance

- › 174 000 km<sup>2</sup> (January 2023)
- › 133 300 km<sup>2</sup> (January 2026)

## Area available for clearance:

- › 21 000 km<sup>2</sup> (early 2026)



## Sector capacity:

- › **134** mine action operators  
(126 Ukrainian, 8 international)
- › **298** demining machines  
196 operated by government institutions  
102 operated by mine action operators
- › **23** Ukrainian manufacturers  
of humanitarian demining  
machinery and equipment

## 01. Strategic goal Return land to productive use

Established a Technical Committee for the standardization of mine action processes

Expanded the compensation programme for humanitarian demining of agricultural land

Established the Training and Testing Complex (UTTC) for developing innovative technologies in mine action, civil protection and environmental safety

Created a Register of territories contaminated or potentially contaminated with explosive hazards

47 mechanized demining machines and tools certified

# PRODUCTION OF DEMINING MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT

In March 2026, the experimental project on certification of humanitarian demining machinery and equipment, which lasted two years, was completed.



**Result.** The market for humanitarian demining machinery and equipment has been opened:

- **23 Ukrainian manufacturers** of humanitarian demining machinery and equipment
- **A catalogue of machinery and equipment** produced and certified in Ukraine has been created
